Educational Materials Distribution Policy

The Metropolitan North Georgia Water Planning District (Metro Water District) supports water conservation and watershed protection in the 15-county metro Atlanta region through public outreach, technical assistance programs and a unified Water Resource Management Plan. One part of that work is to produce informational materials to help businesses and private individuals do their part in conserving water, protecting watersheds and preventing stormwater pollution. These materials are paid for by the dues of local member governments and funding from the State of Georgia, but we also strive to make them available for use by anyone who is working to protect our shared water resources. These are our guidelines on the provision of printed materials to various requesters throughout the year:

Up to 2000 printed materials and other resources available for:

- Jurisdiction (county, city, or authority) members of the District
- Basin Advisory Council and Metro Water District Governing Board members
- Non-profit or business partners on a specific project (for materials on that project)

Up to 500 copies of each material per year, plus printable source files:

- State of Georgia departments doing environmental work or outreach within the District
- Federal government entities doing environmental work or outreach within the District
- Environmental non-profits partnered with utilities or local governments within the District
- Public schools within the District

Up to 100 copies of each material per year, plus printable source files:

- Jurisdictions within the State of Georgia, but not within the Metro Water District
- Businesses and non-profits within the District
- Private schools within the District

Printable source files:

- Anyone!
- Jurisdictions in other states
- Schools outside of the District
- Businesses or non-profits outside of the District
- State or federal agencies doing work outside of the District
