Water Drop Dash and Water Festival Update

Ms. Amedu announced Saturday March 16, 2013 as new date for the first annual Water Drop Dash race and water festival. The permit was accepted by the City of Roswell. Partners were encouraged to participate in the event by hosting a table at the water festival, volunteer for the day or host a race team. Unique Collaborations

Ms. Stephanie Butcher from Coweta County Cooperative Extension presented an overview of the Coweta County Water Education Team. This team is made up of representatives from Coweta County School District, Coweta County Cooperative Extension, Coweta Water Authority, Newnan Utilities and Cargill Inc. The team works collaboratively to provide water education and outreach to the students in Coweta County Schools. Programs include teacher training, essay contest, and school water conservation competition.

Ms. Sharon Smith provided an overview of the GAWP Wonder of Water Children's Water Festival. This collaborative event has been held annually since 2004 during Drinking Water Week. The event is made possible through a partnership among local water utilities in metro Atlanta. Each partner invites an entire 4th grade class from their service area. Students spend the day at one of the Chattahoochee River National Recreation Area park units learning about water resources through hands-on activity stations.

Comments related to the draft materials were noted and will be taken under consideration as the documents are finalized. My Drop County Creative Material Update

Ms. Vallianos discussed the status of the My Drop Counts creative materials. Creative spots for three video PSAs, three radio PSAs, and five outdoor advertisement designs are in production. Final creative materials will be completed in March and be presented at the May Education TCC meeting.

- Ms. Vallianos facilitated a brief discussion of the events occurring throughout the Metro Water District in the coming months.
