RE: Proposed 2024 Year End and 2025 Budget Revisions

The District operates on a fiscal calendar year.

The 2024 Year End Budget Revision incorporates adjustments for interest income, miscellaneous income and projected expenditures for the remainder of the year.

The 2025 Budget Revision reflects the revised estimated Beginning Fund Balance, along with adjustments for new grant revenue, revised fringe/overhead rates, and contract expenses.

<u>2024 Budget Revision</u> – The District proposes a revision to the 2024 budget to incorporate adjustments for projected revenues and expenditures for the remainder of the year.

Revenues – Miscellaneous Fees were reduced to reflect the anticipated number of submittals to the Post Construction Stormwater Technical Assistance Program through the end of the year.

Expenses – The Chairman's Allowance has been reduced based on anticipated expenditures for the remainder of the year. The Salaries/Fringe Benefits/Overhead line items have been reduced to reflect savings in fulltime staff hours due to staff turnover. The Contracts/Miscellaneous Operating/Public Awareness line items have been adjusted to reflect anticipated expenses by the end of the year.

Following these revisions, the projected 2024 Ending Fund Balance is expected to increase from \$985,153 to \$1,161,204.

<u>2025 Budget Revision</u> - In response to the 2024 Year End Budget Revision, we have also proposed the attached revision to the 2025 budget to update the estimated Beginning Fund Balance and reflect changes to the anticipated revenues and expenditures.

Beginning Fund Balance - The estimated Beginning Fund Balance has been modified to reflect the 2024 Projected Ending Fund Balance which increased from \$985,153 to \$1,161,204.

Revenues – The 2024 budget revision reflects a new State Funding line item to include a grant received from the Georgia Environmental Protection Division 319 non-point source grant program for a District-wide Stormwater Management Infrastructure Mapping Strategy project. The total grant will be \$250,000 between 2025 and 2026. This line item reflects 80 percent of the total grant funding anticipated to be received in 2025.

Expenses – The 2025 budget revision reflects a decrease in the Atlanta Regional Commission's Fringe Benefits rate from 50% to 48% and a slight increase in the Overhead rate from 33.2% to 33.5% since the board approved the budget on June 6, 2024. The Contracts line item has been increased to reflect the anticipated expenditures from the Georgia EPD 319 grant within 2025.

Following these revisions, the projected 2025 Ending Fund Balance would increase from \$816,282 to \$1,008,626.

Note that in June 2011 the Board adopted the following financial policy: the District will establish and strive to maintain a minimum fund balance of \$300,000 for operating contingencies.

The District's Finance Committee held a conference call meeting on November 21, 2024, at 11:00 a.m. to review the proposed budget revisions for 2024 and 2025 and recommended the revisions be moved to the Executive Committee for consideration.
