Chairman's Update

Reflections on the Retreat

Chairman Page reflected on the 2023 Governing Board Retreat held in Camilla, GA in May. During the retreat, Board members took a tour of UGA's C.M. Stripling Irrigation Research Center and learned about efficiency advancements in Georgia's agriculture industry. Board members were also able to experience a panel discussion with Mr. Robin Singletary, Mr. Gordon Rogers, Mr. Mark Masters, and Ms. Katherine Zitsch on the connections between urban and agricultural water management in the Flint River.

Schedule for 2023/2024

Chairman Page presented the meeting schedule for BACs, TCC, and the Board for the remainder of 2023 and the Board meeting schedule for 2024. The 2024 Governing Board Retreat will be held at Clayton County Water Authority's Shamrock Community Use Building on Thursday, June 6, 2024.

District Staffing Update

Chairman Page announced changes to District management staff. Ms. Katherine Zitsch was promoted to Atlanta Regional Commission's Deputy Chief Operating Officer and Senior Water Policy Advisor. Mr. Danny Johnson was promoted to Managing Director of ARC's Natural Resource Department and Director of the District. Sarah Skinner was promoted to Manager of the District.

Staff Updates

Education and Outreach

Ms. Sarah Skinner provided an overview of ongoing education activities and events including the announcement of the 2024 Water Drop Dash being held on March 16 at the Chattahoochee Nature Center and the 2023 Middle School Essay Contest. Ms. Skinner also gave an update of the Virtual Learning Journey project in partnership with GPB and invited the Board members to attend the second annual Imagine a Day Without Water event in partnership with Dad's Garage Improv Theatre.

Water Supply Status – Litigation Update

Ms. Katherine Zitsch presented an overview of rainfall and lake levels across the District. Ms. Zitsch also presented an update on litigation within the Apalachicola-Chattahoochee-Flint River basin and the Alabama-Coosa-Tallapoosa River basin.

Website Redesign Walkthrough

Ms. Justine Schwartz presented the newly launched redesign of the District website, which underwent its last major redesign in 2014. Ms. Schwartz walked Board members through the high-level changes to content, new navigations, and pages of importance to the Board, including the new Board portal where members will find individualized profiles, committee information, and meeting details.

District Guidance on Embedding Stormwater Best Management Practices

Ms. Katherine Atteberry provided an overview of an optional guidance document prepared by District Staff addressing embedded stormwater best management practices and the outreach to local stormwater managers that has taken place since the Governing Board retreat in May. Since the retreat, Ms. Atteberry has worked with stakeholders and incorporated comments to update the optional guidance document. Mr. Tony Carnell made a motion to approve posting to the District website the Optional Guidance on Embedding Stormwater Best Management Practices. The motion was seconded by Mr. Shearouse and passed without opposition.

Aging Infrastructure – Repair and Replacement Planning

Mr. Danny Johnson and Ms. Katherine Atteberry provided an overview of repair and replacement planning for aging infrastructure. Board members engaged in discussion and agreed that education efforts and advocating for funding are critical.

RE: Proposed 2023 Year End and 2024 Budget Revisions

The 2023 Year End Budget Revision incorporates adjustments for miscellaneous income and projected expenditures for the remainder of the year.

The 2024 Budget Revision reflects the revised estimated Beginning Fund Balance, and revised Salaries/Fringe/Overhead, and Public Education Budget.

The District operates on a fiscal calendar year.

<u>2023 Budget Revision</u> – The District proposes a revision to the 2023 budget to incorporate adjustments for projected revenues and expenditures for the remainder of the year.

Revenues – Miscellaneous Fees were reduced to reflect the anticipated number of submittals to the Post Construction Stormwater Technical Assistance Program through the end of the year.

Expenses – The Chairman's Allowance has been reduced based on anticipated expenditures for the remainder of the year. The Salaries line item has been reduced to reflect savings in fulltime staff hours due to staff turnover. The Miscellaneous Operating line item has increased to reflect additional expenses related to website development. The Public Awareness/Education line item has been increased by \$10,000 to accommodate the first half of the total amount of a new contract with Georgia Public Broadcasting to develop a Virtual Learning Journey project related to water education. The remaining half of the total amount will be reflected in the 2024 budget.

Following these revisions, the projected 2023 Ending Fund Balance is expected to increase from \$799,104 to \$906,160.

<u>2024 Budget Revision</u> - In response to the 2023 Year End Budget Revision, we have also proposed the attached revision to the 2024 budget to update the estimated Beginning Fund Balance, Salaries, Fringe, Overhead, and Public Education Budget.

Beginning Fund Balance - The estimated Beginning Fund Balance has been modified to reflect the 2023 Projected Ending Fund Balance which increased from \$799,104 to \$906,160.

Revenues – No proposed changes.

Expenses – The 2024 budget revision reflects an increase in staff salaries along with an equivalent decrease in Fringe and Overhead since the board approved the budget on May 12, 2023. The District Salaries increased from \$647,325 to \$712,588 to reflect an overall increase in the number of staff hours and number of personnel working on District activities budgeted in 2024. The additional budget for salary came from a decrease in the ARC overhead/indirect rate during ARC's budgeting process. The increased salary budget does not increase the overall District budget. When combined with a reduction in the Fringe rate (52.0% to 50.0%) and a reduction in the Overhead rate (44.7% to 33.2%) based on estimates from ARC, the sum of Salaries, Fringe, and Overhead, remains unchanged. The Public Education/Awareness line item has been increased by \$10,000 to accommodate the remaining half of the total amount of the 2023 contract with Georgia Public Broadcasting to develop a Virtual Learning Journey project.

Following these revisions, the projected 2024 Ending Fund Balance would increase from \$758,194 to \$855,252.

Note that in June 2011 the Board adopted the following financial policy: the District will establish and strive to maintain a minimum fund balance of \$300,000 for operating contingencies.

The District's Finance Committee held a conference call meeting on October 31, 2023, at 10:00 a.m. to review the proposed budget revisions for 2023 and 2024 and recommends that they be adopted.
